### God's Steadfast Love

I give thanks for your steadfast love and faithfulness.... For though the Lord is high, he regards the lowly.

-Psalm 138:2b, 6a

I recently read about a young couple who lost their small home in the wildfire that swept through Altadena earlier in January. Wearing masks, they went back to see if they could salvage any of their belongings. She planned to look for anything that might be worth keeping; he focused on where his desk had been—because he had placed an engagement ring in a drawer and had been planning to ask her to marry. Indeed, the ring was there, whole, but rather charred looking. Next to the rubble, he asked her to marry him, and after giving him a tearful hug, she said yes. Their love endured their loss, and looked to the future with hope.

God's faithful people proclaim over and over that not only does God's love endure, but it endures forever, and God's love is steadfast and faithful. The writer of Psalm 138, one of our Sunday lectionary Psalms for this month, declares twice in eight verses that their experience and faith that God's love is enduring and steadfast. What does that love look like?

Though God is in the highest of high places, with the members of the heavenly court and earthly kings both recognizing and praising the greatness of God's glory, there is an astonishing, even scandalous twist to God's glory. God

does a very unregal and seemingly ungodly thing: God, the very highest of the high, attends to the helpless and vulnerable, those on the margins of faith and life! This is extraordinary. The high and mighty simply do not do this sort of thing. They are too far removed to consider the plight of those who are distressed, weak, insecure, low, in jeopardy. Yet here the tables are turned. The psalmist suggests that the very height of highness and glory are attributed to God, not because God aspires to these things, but because God stretched out a divine hand to reach low and deliver the lost and downcast. This is what God's steadfast love and faithfulness looks like.

So in our gospel readings in Luke for worship, Jesus insists that God's love extends to outsiders (Luke 4:21-30), that God's love works in the deep (Luke 5:1-11), that God blesses the poor, the hungry, and weeping (Luke 6:17-26), and that God loves our enemies, the ungrateful, and the wicked (Luke 6:27-38).

This month, let us give thanks to God, for God's steadfast love endures forever!


